

1. Purpose

Denison Mines Corp. recognizes the importance of ensuring equal access and participation for people with disabilities and treating people with disabilities in a way that allows them to maintain their dignity and independence.

Denison is also committed to meeting our accessibility requirements under the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act*, Ontario's accessibility laws and its current and ongoing obligations under the Ontario *Human Rights Code*.

2. Application

This Accessibility Policy (the "Policy") applies to all Ontario employees of Denison Mines Corp. and its subsidiaries (collectively "Denison" or "the Company").

3. Accessibility

Employees are expected to at all times be respectful of people with disabilities.

"Disability" includes, but is not limited to, any degree of physical, mental, or developmental impairment or disability, learning disability or dysfunction, and mental disorders.

For our premises that are open to the public and third parties, we will welcome and accommodate the use of assistive devices, as well as:

- A support person who accompanies the person with disabilities, and/or
- A service animal.

When we cannot easily identify that an animal is a service animal, our staff may ask for documentation (template, letter or form) from a regulated health professional that confirms the person needs the service animal for reasons relating to their disability.

4. Notice of Temporary Disruption

In the event of a planned or unexpected disruption to services or facilities for employees, visitors, contractors or other third parties with disabilities, Denison will notify those individuals promptly.

When a disruption arises on Denison premises, a highly visible notice will be posted. This notice will explain the reason for the disruption, the anticipated duration of the disruption, and alternative facilities or accommodation available.

5. Information and Communication

We are committed to communicating with people with disabilities in ways that take into account their disability. We will work with the person with the disability to determine what method of communication works best for them.

Should accessible formats or communication support (i.e. larger font copies, text-to-speech programs) be required, Denison will provide them free of charge.

6. Hiring & Employment

As required and appropriate, accommodations can be made during the recruitment and hiring process upon request. In such case, Denison will consult with the applicant and provide or arrange for suitable accommodation.

We will consult with any employees who make a request for accommodation on account of a disability when arranging for the provision of suitable accommodation in a manner that takes into account their accessibility needs, and the nature of the employee's job.

Where required, we will also provide customized emergency information to help an employee with a disability during an emergency. With the employee's consent, we will provide workplace emergency information to a designated person who is providing assistance to that employee during an emergency.

7. Administration

If employees have questions or concerns regarding this Policy, they should speak with their manager and/or any representative of Human Resources.

As considered appropriate, the Company will conduct suitable training on the goals and requirements of this Policy and/or the accessibility standards under the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act*, Ontario's accessibility laws and the *Ontario Human Rights Code* as it pertains to persons with disabilities.

8. Feedback

Should anyone wish to provide feedback to Denison regarding accessibility they are welcome to do so. Feedback will be reviewed, addressed promptly and responded to should the individual wish to be identified.

Completing your accessibility compliance report

You must complete the mandatory fields on each page before you can move to the next page. Mandatory fields are marked with an asterisk (*).

To start, save the form on your computer. Be sure to open the form with the latest version of Adobe Reader. You can save the form at any point in the process and return to it later. You may distribute the form within your organization for input before submitting.

You need the following to file your accessibility compliance report:

- organization legal name
- 9-digit business number (BN9). This is the number that Canada Revenue Agency uses to identify your organization. You can find it on your federal or provincial tax return. If your organization does not have a business number (BN9), contact us to receive an AODA identifier to be used in place of a business number (BN9).
- organization category (Ontario Public Service/Ontario Legislative Assembly, Designated Public Sector, Business or Non-profit)

Note: If you select the wrong organization category, you may see questions that do not apply to you. You will need to correct the category and enter your data again to successfully submit your report.

- number of employees in your organization in Ontario
- name and contact information of your certifier (a director or senior officer with legal authority to say that the report is complete and accurate)

File for up to 20 organizations at once

You can use one form to file a report for up to 20 organizations. To do so, you need each organization's:

- legal name
- business number (BN9) or AODA identifier
- number of employees in Ontario
- address

Each organization must have the same:

- organization category
- number of employees range (e.g. 20-49, 50+)
- certifier
- answers to all of the accessibility compliance questions

If not, you will need to complete a separate form for each organization.

Note: Users of assistive technology should pull up a list of buttons to get a list of the links on the form.

Begin your report

Follow these steps to complete your form:

1. Download and save the form

- Download and save the form on your computer
- Open the form with the latest version of Adobe Reader

2. Enter your organization's information

- Enter your organization's information then select **Next**

3. Understand your requirements

- If you need information about the requirements, select the website link in **section B: Understand your accessibility requirements**. This will bring you to our website where you can see your requirements.

4. Certify your report

- Complete the Certifier Information section
- The certifier must:
 - make sure all information on the form is complete and accurate
 - check the box to show they have authority to certify your organization
 - enter the certification date or select it from the drop-down calendar
- Enter your organization's primary contact. This is the person to be contacted if more information is needed. This person may be the certifier or a different person.

5. Answer the questions

- The questions on the form are based on the requirements that apply to your:
 - organization category
 - number of employees range
- Select **Yes** (if you are in compliance) or **No** (if you are not in compliance) for each question. You may add comments in the comment box below each question.
- Each report question has links to:
 - the regulation section that is related to that question
 - helpful resources to help you understand and comply with the requirements
- Once you have answered all of the questions, select **Save form** at the bottom of the page before selecting **Next**
- Review the accessibility compliance report summary.

6. Submit your report

- You may save the form at any time by selecting the **Save form** button. When you are ready to submit your report, select the **Save and Submit button**. You will be prompted to save the form on your computer first and then it will be submitted.
- Wait for a confirmation prompt with a confirmation number that either confirms submission or indicates any problems.
- Once the report is received, an email will be sent to the Certifier and the Primary Contact. This email will include:
 - a confirmation number
 - an accessible PDF copy of your report

Instructions

All information you provide is subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

If you are a public sector organization with **20 or more employees** that is not designated under the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (IASR) you are to comply with the IASR as a private/not-for-profit organization and complete the appropriate Accessibility Compliance Report. If you are a public sector organization with **fewer than 20 employees** that is not designated under the IASR, you are to comply with the IASR as a small business/non-profit organization and are exempt from the requirement to submit a report.
